II. Open Session For Public Comment

III. Teacher Certification (Laurie Bussmann)

Ms. Laurie Bussmann gave a presentation about the certification status of Amistad Academy teachers. Despite progress made in getting more teacher certified last year (48% to 71%), Amistad dipped back down at the start of this year because of new hires. Unlike last year, AF is implementing consequences at AF Hartford. Consequences attached to the incentives are resulting in more responsiveness.

The percent currently certified at Amistad is 57% (started with 52% at the beginning of the year). Within the next few weeks, the numbers will go up again.

The Board discussed ideas of consequences and incentives and the balance between holding onto strong teachers while also reaching 100% certification. The Amistad charter is up for renewal in 2017 and the Board expressed their dissatisfaction with the lack of year-over-year progress and concerns that this

could be a repeated cycle. Laurie Bussmann responded with the ways in which AF has changed the messaging, the consequences and the strong alignment from senior leadership to regional superintendents to principals to operations staff around the fact that this is a top priority.

IV. SBAC Results (Carolyn Greenspan)

Having discussed the SBAC results at the September 4th meeting, the board did not discuss the SBAC results further.

V. Treasurer's Report (Mike Griffin)

Mr. Mike Griffin led the Treasurer's Report reviewing the financials provided. A tentative audit report will be in October and the finance committee will meet with the auditors. October 1st is the date when the State determines how many students are in each school. Mr. Max Polaner reports the elementary and middle schools are on target and the high school is overenrolled.

Mr. Griffin also reported out on the staffing on AF's Team Finance and concluded with some comments about the funding challenges that AF faces having not gotten increases from the State in our per-pupil funding. Ms. Khadijah Muhammad shared with the Board that there is an effort to get parents involved in advocating for money follows the child.

Ms. Pat Sweet would like to have a future conversation to better understand how philanthropy is allocated to each charter.

She invited the Board to come visit between 11:47am and 12:50pm during student council meeting on 10/2 or 10/9.

II. Reports

A. Joint High School Update

Ms. Caroline Williams gave a report from the Joint High School Committee. She detailed Principal Claire Polcrack's three main points of emphasis - Reading, Joy and Community.

They have added an additional four stops to the Bridgeport late bus, allowing more students to stay after for additional help or work.

The biggest challenge right now is teacher retention - two teachers have quit abruptly within the first few weeks/days of school. Ms. Polcrack and members of the leadership team are working on different strategies to prevent such occurrences from happening again.

B. Governance Committee (Marnie Halsey)

In June 2015, the Governance Committee created a sub-committee to review the bylaws . The sub-committee has been reviewing bylaws since then, and proposed changes to the bylaws will hopefully be distributed before the next Board Meeting.

In addition, the Roles and Responsibility document will be discussed at the next meeting Ms. Halsey instructed all Board Members to read and review the document before the next Board Meeting. Board members will also be required to attend a (re-)orientation session in October and submit to a background check pursuant to new state of Connecticut regulations.

Mr. Scot Kerr explained a number of changes in relation to compliance with authorizers. In particular, the Board is now required to attend a training session before the renewal in 2017, submit to a background check, and sign a new conflict of interest agreement with a new anti-nepotism clause.
